Charles Hunt Jardine, Lieutenant 2nd Battalion The Royal Scots, attached King's African Rifles, was the son of Thomas Jardine of "St Margaret's", Juniper Green, and his wife Eliza Ann Jardine.



He was born in Edinburgh in 1896. Educated at George Heriot's School, Edinburgh. He joined the O.T.C 1910-1914, where he was a Lance Corporal.

He was gazetted 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant 14<sup>th</sup> Royal Scots, on 23<sup>rd</sup> September 1914. Promoted to Lieutenant in 1915 with the 29<sup>th</sup> Division, he served in Gallipoli. He was posted to France in 1916, and twice wounded. Transferred to the King's African Rifles, German East Africa in 1917.

He was killed in action on 3<sup>rd</sup> May 1918, aged 22, at Koronje, Portuguese East Africa.

He is Remembered with Honour at Pembra Cemetery East Africa, George Heriot's School, and Colinton War Memorial.
