## John Russell Benham 1895 - 1915 2nd Lieutenant, 100th Battery, Royal Field Artillery

John Russell Benham,
2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant, 100<sup>th</sup> Battery, Royal
Field Artillery, was the only son of
Edwin Arthur Russell Benham, of
Colombo, Ceylon, now Sri Lanka, a
Tea Planter and Tea Merchant, and
his wife Grizzell Hamilton Stewart
of Glenlinden, Colinton.

He was born in Colombo, 19<sup>th</sup>
September,1895. Educated at Mr Perkin's Matfield
Grange, Paddock Wood, Rugby School and Royal Military
Academy, Woolwich.

He was gazetted 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant, 17<sup>th</sup> November 1914, and sent to France with the 28<sup>th</sup> Divisional Ammunition Column on 16<sup>th</sup> January 1915, and was immediately posted to the 100<sup>th</sup> Battery. Later he served for a short time with G Battery, Royal Horse Artillery, and then returned to his own regiment.

He died of wounds received in action, near Ypres, 4<sup>th</sup> May 1915, aged 19. His commanding officer wrote "...that through the most trying times he proved himself a soldier for all his youth."

He is Remembered with Honour at Bailleul Communal Cemetery Extension, (Nord) France. Rugby School, Dean Cemetery and Colinton War Memorial.
