

Minutes of the Annual General Meeting of St Cuthbert's Scottish Episcopal Church, Colinton, held on Sunday 22 November 2020, at 2.00 pm by Zoom.

The meeting was chaired by the Rector, Nicki McNelly, and attended by Office Bearers, members of Vestry and in total 36 members of the congregation. This year due to restrictions in place to curb the Covid-19 pandemic a meeting could not be held in the Hall and a shortened AGM was held by Zoom.

The Rector thanked people for attending and opened the meeting with a prayer.

2. To Receive the Report and Accounts of Vestry:

- i. Acceptance of the Minutes of the 2019 Annual General Meeting
- **ii.** The Treasurer ensured that everybody had access to a copy of the summary of accounts for the Year ending 31st August 2020 and the budget for next year (this was done by email or post this year). He explained that the full set of accounts were available on request by email to the Church administrator or by visiting the Church website.

The Treasurer stated that the year had been far from normal for the Church due to the effects of the Covid-19 Pandemic. Some items of income were down such as congregational giving, as the Church had been closed, but they were offset by reduced expenditure in other areas (e.g. the inability to carry out planned maintenance).

Two legacies had been gratefully received from Ian Kinnear and Margaret Cowan and amounted to around £15,000. It was noted that money from Margaret Cowan's legacy is going to be used to buy a new electric piano for choir rehearsals.

The net effect after the receipt of the legacies was a surplus of £17,126. The gain on the value of the investments of £219,218 means that there was a combined surplus of £236,344. The value of the investments has gone up significantly this year. There was a fall in value of investments at the start of the pandemic, then a significant rise in value has been due to the management of the portfolio by stockbrokers. All of the funds are invested in the Scottish Episcopal Church Unit Trust Pool so the increase in the value of the fund is shared with other Episcopal churches, the Province and the Dioceses. The Treasure asked the congregation to remember that whilst over the past two years the value of the investments has grown by over 30% this cannot be guaranteed and shouldn't be taken as representative of future growth. The budget for 2021 is a best guess as to what might happen. Income will continue to be constrained by the attendances at church and hall usage. Significant work will be carried out on the church, hall and rectory roofs as identified in the Quinquennial report. Overall we anticipate a deficit in the region of £64,000.

Other expenditure will likely include new lighting for the church and hall, which is as yet uncosted. We are also looking at a replacement for the church printer, which is now often unreliable.

The Treasurer mentioned that last year he had mentioned the review of the use of the church buildings and spaces. We have put a bigger project on hold given the pandemic situation but intend to take forward a smaller scheme looking at moving the organ, utilising the bell tower, and creating separate space in the lady chapel and transept. This requires us firstly to look at acoustics and heating as a first stage and that is being taken forward. We will share our thinking with you once these reports have been finalised.

The Treasurer gave grateful thanks to Robin Holmes, Barry Tatlock and Marie Neil and pointed out that they did most of the finance work throughout the year.

The minutes and accounts were accepted.
