





VESTRY REPORT Vestry May 2025



Message for June from Revd Margaret.

As the days continue to move ever swiftly onwards, we now happily find ourselves surrounded by the fresh green of the trees and the vivid colours of newly opened flowers. Such scenes have brought to my mind that well-known quotation from Robert Browning: 'God's in his heaven — All's right with the world.' But sadly, as I watch the news or follow other media outlets, I'm confronted with a completely opposing picture; startling reports of continuing and increasing violence, greed, power-hungriness, devastating poverty and a degrading environment. How can all be right with the world?

One answer to that challenge to our faith is to dig deeply into such appalling reports and find the concern and caring emanating from so many other human beings as they reach out to assist the suffering. Additionally, we can search the annals of history or our own experiences to see humanity's recovery from desolation, to see God's gifts to his flawed creatures being utilised to offer not just compassionate aid, but beauty, beneficial innovation and constructive improvements to our life on earth.

In early May I took a mini cruise to the Netherlands, where such thoughts became dominant. Starting in Amsterdam, I was firstly reminded of the impact of the diary of the young Anne Frank, whose family were sadly betrayed to the Nazis, and secondly of the incredible Corrie Ten Boom, whose deeply held religious beliefs motivated her to resist the Nazis by successfully sheltering and saving the lives of hundreds of Jews and other refugees.

We then sailed to Rotterdam, flattened by the Nazis, but totally rebuilt after the end of the war, resurrecting itself into a thriving, successful metropolis, with tree-lined avenues and buildings incorporating both housing and businesses. Looking ahead, in a country much of which lies below sea level, all construction was based on piles driven deep down.

Moving beyond compassionate aid and positive innovation to considering beauty, I was fortunate to visit the charming and historic little city of Delft, home of the renowned artist, Vermeer, and site of the world-famous Delft Pottery, creating blue faience ware. During a visit to the Pottery Museum and factory, I was absolutely stunned by the exquisite creations and the delicacy of the handmade pieces.

God has indeed given human beings the most amazing gifts for good, so I pray that these will gradually overcome the forces of evil which often threaten to overcome his lovingly designed creation.

Recycling

In trying to do our bit for the environment, we aim to recycle as much of our waste in church as possible and there is a blue box outside for glass jars and bottles and two green recycling bins for dry recyclables. To encourage us to recycle there is a small white bin outside the kitchen for recyclables that is emptied into the outside green bins when full. However, if we put the wrong or dirty things into the recycling bin the whole amount can be rejected at the recycling centre, and then it must go to landfill. This is the same for your green recycling bin at home.

What you CAN put into the recycling bin:

- rinsed and empty plastic food and drink containers e.g. Milk containers, yoghurt pots, trays, plastic bottles and lids
- paper including envelopes and cardboard not contaminated with food and free of Sellotape and brown plastic tape
- drinks/food cans (rinsed and empty)
- clean aluminium foil
- Tetra Pak juice cartons (rinsed and empty)
- White coffee cup lids, rinsed.

What you CANNOT put in the recycling bin:


- Tissues, paper towels
- Soft plastics (e.g. biscuit, sweet wrappers, clingfilm, crisp packets, carrier bags, plastic wallets)
- Disposable coffee/hot drinks cups
- Polystyrene
- Food or liquids
- Black plastic containers, wood, glass
- Batteries, electrical items (small electrical e.g. no bigger than a toaster can be placed on top of the glass recycling bin).

Thank you for helping us to recycle responsibly.

Soft plastics and batteries are collected for recycling at local supermarkets, and we would encourage everybody to do this. Hilary collects the washed lids off milk containers to raise money for charity.


