Dear Friends,

November draws us gently into a season of reflection. As the days shorten and the year turns, we find ourselves invited into a deeper stillness - one that encourages us to remember.

This month, we mark **Remembrance Sunday**, a solemn occasion across the UK when we pause as a nation to honour the lives lost in conflict and to pray for peace. We remember not to glorify war, but to acknowledge its cost—and to commit ourselves afresh to the way of peace.

This year I had the great privilege of being invited to join The Lord Provost's Wreath Laying Party, at the annual opening ceremony of the Edinburgh Garden of Remembrance, at The Scott Monument. A very special and poignant event.



Remembrance, in the Christian tradition, however, is never simply looking back. It is an act of holy attention. When Jesus said, "*Do this in remembrance of me,*" He called us not just to recall His

death, but to let His love shape our lives here and now. We remember in order to be transformed.

This month, as the leaves fall and the liturgical year comes to a close, the Church also leads us into a rhythm of remembering: we celebrate **All Saints and All Souls**, giving thanks for those who have gone before us in faith and we prepare for **Advent**, waiting in hope for the light to come. Memory and hope are never far apart in our tradition.

On our celebration of All Souls, we will have a visiting priest, Jaakko Niiles, from the Diocese of Espoo preaching for us. Jaakko and another colleague, Aino, will then join me and others at our annual Clergy Conference at Pitlochry.

We have our AGM on November 23rd, where 5 new members will be elected on to the Vestry. It will be the first time in my eight years that we will have a full Vestry. Thank you to all the wonderful volunteers. We are, however, still looking for a Property Convenor.

I hope you can join us for the AGM, but please remember to get any questions sent to Julia beforehand.

I am Jaakko Niiles, a pastor from Finland.

I work in the Diocese of Espoo as a consultant, supporting and enabling the work that takes place in our local congregations.

My responsibilities include ordination training, promoting a sustainable future, and working with issues related to diaconal ministry and Christian education.

Our family lives in Helsinki, and we have three small children. Life is full and lively — if you know what I mean. I also follow football with great enthusiasm. You'll never walk alone is a powerful reminder both on the pitch and in life. Looking forward to spending time with you all.

The Diocese of Espoo is a diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Finland and the seat of the bishop of Espoo. The Diocese was established in 2004, so it is the newest of the nine dioceses of our church. The current bishop of Espoo is Kaisamari Hintikka. The Diocese comprises 19 congregations and 1600 employees.

VESTRY REPORT - October 2025



- A new door mat has been purchased for the hall porch and the hot tap in the 'Gents' toilet is now working.
- Steven McLeish will give a talk about the Leprosy Mission during the Church service on Sunday 30th November.
- Heather sent a revised Budget for the next two years via email. This was approved by Vestry, and they will be printed in the Sign. Heather informed vestry that last year's accounts are with the auditors who are in the process of checking and preparing them. We hope to have these back for review and approval at the November Vestry meeting.
- Nicki confirmed that all the helpers that attend the children's choir sessions now have PVG certificates.
- Julia is to request a written Treasurer's report for the AGM from Heather, originally with an idea that it may be possible to print this in the AGM booklet. However, after consultation with Marie following the Vestry meeting, it will be read out at the AGM as usual, by Andrew or Bryan on behalf of the Treasurer and they will also reply to questions about the finances/budget that were submitted before the AGM, where an answer has been obtained from Heather.
- Frances and Susan are standing down from Vestry, and we have five people who have agreed to be put forward to stand for Vestry. The congregation will be asked if there is anybody that they would like to put forward to stand for Vestry. Forms will be at the back of the church.
- Nicki confirmed that there will be a St Cuthbert's Vestry training day on the 7th of March 2026 with Jane McLaren.
- The Rectory kitchen is nearly finished. The designer made some errors with measurements so that the existing fridge freezer no longer fits and the blinds can't be used properly. A fault in the splash back and cooker hood means that the latter is to be replaced.
- Quinquennial repairs: Nicki is conscious that we have not confirmed that all of these have been done and asked if anybody on Vestry would take on the role of checking this and ensuring that they have been completed or are in process. Nobody came forward and Nicki advised that if she does this then she has less time for pastoral work.

- The advertisement for the new bishop is now live, and the closing date is October 31st 2025.
- There are several external carol services/concerts happening in December:
 51 Brigade Carol Service- Tuesday 9th December
 Clarinet Quartet Carol Concert at 11.30am after the Wednesday 10.30am Service on 10th December (players from the Royal Regiment of Scotland).
 Children's Choir Concert – 13th December before our Christmas afternoon tea.
 Carols at the Colinton Inn- 17th December 7-8pm
 Nine lessons and Carols- Sunday 21st December at 5pm, (suggestions for readers from our local community are welcomed).
- Nicki has finalised a poster for 'St Cuthbert's Invites you' with the plan to put one in every pew note for us all to give to a neighbour or friend, or to put up on a notice board. She will need help on the four Saturdays in December that this is running.
- The Curate that Nicki was hoping for has been sent to the Cathedral and so St Cuthbert's will not get a Curate next year.
- Nicki has been asked to be a diocesan advisor to an ordinand in training. She is a member of St Martin's. Nicki has a meeting on the 10th of November to find out more about this role.
- In her role as International Convenor, Nicki will accompany Bishop Anne of Dunedin on a one-day tour of Edinburgh.
- In November, we have two visitors from Espoo, Finland, attending Clergy Conference. One of them, Jaakko Niiles, will preach here on Sunday 2nd November.
- Nicki and Vestry thanks everybody from our events committee and their helpers for the lovely Harvest Lunch.
- Kay has a range of brochures on eco heating solutions for churches. She will keep hold of these for future reference.

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Message for November from Revd Margaret.

It struck me that November is a good month to think about saints. After all, we start the month with the celebration of All Saints and finish it by honouring St. Andrew, the patron saint of our own country, Scotland.

But who are the saints? So often it's assumed that these are the people who have been canonised, like St. Columba or St. James, but in actual fact we, as Christians are all called to be saints, God's holy people or nation, as Peter proclaims in his First Epistle. Paul, addressing the Christians of Corinth, states emphatically that they were called to be saints, as well as all those everywhere who 'call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.' Yes, it is hoped that, as Christians we will follow the way Jesus showed us, and lead caring, virtuous lives, though I am very sure that we frequently do not feel like saints, being all too aware of our human failings.

However, returning to the canonised, recognised saints, there are some interesting examples listed in our lectionary for November. On the 11th is celebrated the Hungarian born St. Martin of Tours, patron saint of various categories of people including beggars, due to his charitable works. Then on the 22nd is the feast of St. Cecilia, patron saint of musicians – very close to the hearts of all our musicians and music lovers in the congregation.

But the saint I feel it appropriate to emphasise is the subject of Joan's presentation to the Thursday service this month, 6th November, St. Margaret. Wife to King Malcolm of Scots, and canonised in 1093, she is a saint who is very close to home -

closer than you might imagine, so please do come along to this informal service, and join us for refreshments and fellowship in the hall afterwards.

Then, on the 4th December we will be holding our Thursday afternoon Advent service, to be entitled ‘The Four Pillars of Advent – Hope, Peace, Joy and Love,’ so we would be delighted to see you on that occasion too.

In the meantime, may this be a blessed month of preparing ourselves for the Season of Advent, as the days get shorter and the leaves fall from the trees, giving us the opportunity to swish through them as we reminisce over childhood pursuits.

Music Notes

The choir will start this month by singing Walford Davies' familiar and reflective setting of *God be in my Head* – an appropriate choice



following our commemoration of All Saints and All Souls. Although numerous settings of these 15th century words have been composed, Walford Davies's setting of 1910 established their popularity, composed whilst he was organist of The Temple Church in London. The following week, *Prayer for Peace* by Margaret Rizza will be sung as our Remembrance Sunday anthem. This is a very simple and effective piece, new to the choir, by a contemporary composer of church music. We then move to earlier times, with an anthem by JN Hummel (1778 – 1837), an Austrian composer and pianist, chiefly known for his instrumental music, but who also composed sacred music. After that, *Proclaim the story* is a transcription of *Prelude to a Te Deum* by M-A Charpentier (1643 – 1704), and we complete the month by moving into the “season of carols” with an Advent carol taken from the Oxford Book of Carols.

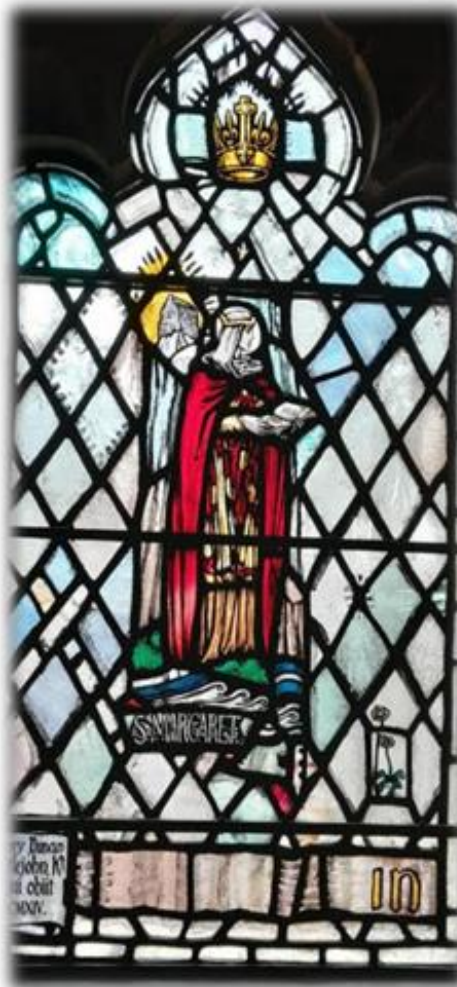

Net Zero Roadshow Saturday July 19 2025

I found this a very interesting and encouraging day, attending with Nicki, which consisted of several workshops addressing actions to work towards Net Zero by 2030 – a motion adopted by the Scottish Episcopal Church in 2023. The team have a website, netzerochurch.scot

The day shared information, resources and advice on a variety of topics:

- Energy efficiency measures and clean energy solutions
- ‘HeatHack’ with advice specifically on heating churches
- National Churches Trust who have some grants for maintenance of buildings
- A Rocha and the Cathedral grounds.

I chose two workshops which were coincidentally linked by an artistic inspiration. In the morning the artist was William Morris whose quote “Stave off Decay by Daily Care” provided a motto for the Churches Trust presentation. This was very practical in terms of maintaining the heritage of church buildings. We shared information and experiences of various churches such as sourcing contractors, and networking with each other for advice and help in our area. The Trust can provide grant funding in certain cases with the mission ...”to keep the UK’s wonderful collection of church buildings well maintained, valued and in use”.

In the afternoon, the artist was Phoebe Anna Traquair, whose murals in the Cathedral Song School are a beautiful celebration of peace and harmony in Nature and an example of the style of the Arts and Crafts movement of William Morris. The workshop was jointly led by the Cathedral Art and Ecology Group and the charity A Rocha. Two members of A Rocha UK led a meditation observing the painting details silently, and sharing our inspirations from them. We then walked around the grounds of the Cathedral where several areas are devoted to encouraging awareness and action for biodiversity, wild plantings and include a striking installation 'On Sacred Ground'.

Five benches and five waymarkers, recording the names and habitats of species at risk of extinction across Scotland in 2025. A celebration of the country's biodiversity and a pre-memorial of what could be lost.

A Rocha's resources include their magazine 'Root & Branch', sharing stories of initiatives by churches across the country to care for and enhance Church land. One example is how a Yorkshire church had help to turn a bare unused corner of their car park into a thriving, flourishing haven for wildlife.

Bringing all together at the end, stories were shared on property matters from St James Goldenacre, St Mary's Dalmahoy and St Columbas by the Castle, as well as our own church. The Net Zero initiative is an ongoing network to facilitate actions and maintenance in our church. One area I think we might look to for next year is to help pollinators in our garden, with a rejuvenation of our wildflower area.

Donations: I have paid in £19.85 in individual donations since July. A few full tubs have been handed in now, so I will send in another group donation soon – please hand in any tubs ready to go or leave in the office.

Steven McLeish, the Scottish Country Head for TLM, is coming to our 10.30 service on 30 November and will give us an update on the work at the moment. He will be with us at coffee afterwards to meet and answer questions. New Day magazines for September are available at the back of the church – please take one to find out about the many worldwide initiatives of TLM.

Projects update: Bihar state in India has some of the highest levels of poverty and leprosy in the country. TLM's Muzaffarpur Hospital is the only place in Bihar where leprosy patients are cared for free of charge. The foundations have been laid for a brand new outpatients' department which had reached a dire condition last year.

Odisha state in India: There is an ongoing appeal to fund food parcels in the colonies where TLM reached out following an appeal in January. Despite ongoing work for new homes, clean water, toilets and growing fruit and vegetables, help has been too late for some of the very elderly and disabled people living there. During intense heat, many were unable to go out to beg and died of hunger. Every gift will be matched so that for a food parcel of £20 lasting a month, another will be donated.

Prayer update: We are asked specially to pray for the small Leprosy Mission Ethiopia team, where civil war and drought have pushed millions into crisis. We pray for people affected by leprosy to receive vital treatment; for government health workers learning to diagnose and treat leprosy; for an end to the conflict and safe travel for the LM team; for the leader of TLM Ethiopia, Bel.
